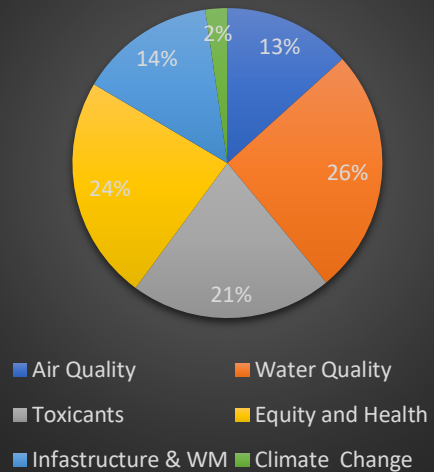

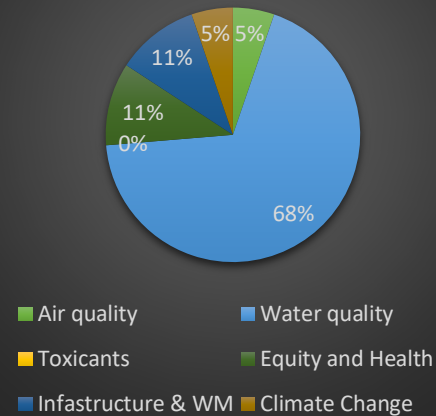
- 217 EPA Environmental Justice Small Grants (EJSG) 2012-2019
- Grants analyzed by capacity, areas of environmental concern and indigenous allocations

There's still a democratic deficit in federal environmental justice grants. But, the failed promise of supporting indigenous communities may be more troubling.
